MAINTENANCE MECHANIC, Pest Control

QUALIFICATIONS

- High School Diploma or equivalence or Florida Special Diploma.
- Minimum of three (3) years of verifiable experience in Pest Control at the commercial level with knowledge of all chemicals and equipment to be used.
- Class "D" or "E" Driver's License required upon start date.
- Certified Pest Control operator or Limited Structural Pesticide license certified through Department of Agriculture and current annual recertification.
- Limited Lawn & Ornamental Pesticide license.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES

- Knowledge of technology as related to specific job functions.
- Ability to access small corridors, corners, and the undersides of furniture and fixtures; ability to access various landscapes and grounds; ability to mix, spray, and utilize spraying tanks.

POSITION GOAL

To provide safe and effective pest control services on District facilities and grounds to minimize nuisance insects and weeds.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES

1. *Ensure safety at all times in storage and use of chemical treatments, traps, baits, etc., in and around school and storage areas.
2. * Maintain a preventive maintenance program at all times to include spraying in and around all cost centers, and provide proper traps and baits when necessary.
3. * Maintain equipment necessary for performance of pest control duties.
4. * Maintain complete records on school plants of all types of treatments used.
5. * Use proper disposal procedures for unused chemicals and chemical containers.
6. * Familiarize self with various types of construction and soil for most effective use of chemicals, etc.
7. * Assist in establishing and provide instruction to Department staff on current regulations pertaining to work area chemical hazards, right to know and understanding MSDS information.
8. * Oversee and ensure the proper completion of work when performed and assisted by assigned Helpers and/or Laborers.
9. * Maintain accountability and inventory for assigned tools and equipment.
10. Perform other duties as assigned by the Division Supervisor.

EQUIPMENT / MATERIALS

Ladders, Lifts, Scaffold, Hand & Power Tools, Pumps, Sprayers and Applicators, Chemical Mixing Equipment, Motor Vehicles, Landscaping Equipment, Bench Equipment, etc.

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PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Heavy Work Exerting up to 100 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES

Standing Assuming an upright position on the feet particularly for sustained periods of time.
Walking Moving about on foot to accomplish tasks, particularly for long distances.
Climbing Ascending or descending ladders, stairs, scaffolding, ramps, poles, etc. Using feet and legs and/or hands and arms.
Balancing Maintaining body equilibrium to prevent falling when walking, standing or crouching on narrow, slippery or moving surfaces.
Bending Lowering the body forward from the waist
Stooping Bending body downward and forward by bending spine at the waist through the use of the lower extremities and back muscles.
Kneeling Bending legs at knee to come to a rest on knee or knees.
Crouching Bending the body downward and forward by bending leg and spine.
Crawling Moving about on hands and knees or hands and feet.
Twisting Moving body from the waist using a turning motion.
Reaching Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction.
Pushing Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force order to thrust forward, downward or outward exerting up to 100 pounds of force.
Pulling Using upper extremities to drag, haul or tug objects in a sustained motion exerting up to 100 pounds of force.
Lifting Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position to position through the use of the upper extremities and back exerting up to 100 pounds of force.
Finger Dexterity Picking, pinching, typing or otherwise working primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand or arm.
Grasping Applying pressure to an object with the fingers and palm.
Feeling Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with the skin, particularly that of fingertips.
Repetitive Motion Substantial and continuous movements of the wrists, hands, and/or fingers.
Talking Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word. Those activities in which detailed or important spoken instructions must be conveyed accurately, loudly or quickly.
Hearing Acuity The ability to perceive speech and other environmental sounds at normal loudness levels.
Visual Acuity The power to see at a level which allows reading of numbers and text, operation of equipment, inspection of machines, etc.

WORKING CONDITIONS

Indoors / Outdoors The worker is subject to both environmental conditions. Activities occur inside and outside.
Cold The worker is subject to extreme cold. Temperatures are below 32 degrees for periods of more than one hour.
Heat The worker is subject to extreme heat. Temperatures are above 100 degrees for periods of more than one hour.
Hazards The worker is subject to hazards. This includes a variety of physical conditions, such as proximity to moving mechanical parts, electrical current, working on scaffolding and high places, and exposure to high heat or chemicals.
Oils The worker is subject to oils. There is air and/or skin exposure to oils and other cutting fluids.
Respirator The worker is required to wear a respirator.
