POSITION GOAL

To assist in preparing and maintaining a system of routes and schedules for all school buses.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. * Maintain current logistical information regarding transportation operations.
- 2. * Transmit instructions and information to exceptional student education buses regarding daily changes in bus routes.
- 3. * Adjust routes and bus loads as needed.
- 4. * Maintain up-to-date route files on all buses.
- 5. * Serve as a substitute driver or a monitor in emergency situations.
- 6. * Assist with routine office telephone communications and procedures
- 7. * Work with transportation operations to investigate complaints from parents, the public, and others regarding the placement of school bus routes, and stops.
