Advanced Placement Test Performance

2015-2016 Data



Crooms Academy of Information Technology administered 271 Advanced Placement exams in 15 courses during the 2015-16 school year (**at no cost** to students). The most popular AP courses are US History, Psychology, US Government and Politics, Environmental Science, and Biology.

CAIT had an average **pass rate of 52%** on AP exams. For comparison, the Florida pass rate was 51%, and the national pass rate was 57%.

All juniors and seniors at CAIT get an opportunity to take the SAT **at no cost**.

The average Crooms Academy of Information Technology SAT score is **1554** out of 2400, which puts it in the top 20% of public high schools in Central Florida.

PSAT Scores

CAIT students in 9-11th grade have an opportunity to take the PSAT **at no cost**.

CAIT 10th graders had an average PSAT score of **1022** out of 1600, which puts it in the top 5% of public high schools in Central Florida.

College Acceleration and Workforce Readiness

2015-2016 Data

87% of CAIT students take some form of acceleration (college-level classes or industry certifications).

CAIT also offers **6 industry certifications**. Some of the most popular ones are Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) Bundle Certification (3 of 6), Photoshop (Creative Cloud 2015 or later), and InDesign. In total, students earned **280 industry certifications**.

Crooms Academy of Information Technology had a **98%** graduation rate.

During the 2016-2017 academic year, CAIT had over **71 Bright Futures** recipients, totalling over **\$1,644,934** in scholarships.

State Assessments

Crooms Academy of Information Technology earned an A grade from the Florida DOE in 2017 and is in the **top 10% of all high schools** statewide.



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- Crooms has a total enrollment of 687 students across grades 9-12.
- We offer specializations in Programming, Multimedia Design Technology, Game and Simulation, Network Systems Technology, and Cybersecurity.
- We give students the opportunity to earn an A.A. degree in Information Technology through Seminole State College.
- The 2017 graduates of Crooms earned a total of over \$1.8 million in scholarships.
- Crooms was recognized as a Distinguished Academy in 2011-2017 and a Magnet School of Distinction in 2015 and 2016.
